
Our Plan will draw up policies to manage development over the next 15 years




## Hunsdon Area Neighbourhood Plan - A Vision for Hunsdon








#### Hunsdon with Eastwick and Gilston Neighbourhood Plan

Hunsdon Parish Council is working jointly with Eastwick and Gilston Parish Council to develop a Neighbourhood Plan covering the geographical area defined in the District Plan as the Gilston Area. This area includes a significant part of Hunsdon Parish.

The Gilston Area will provide 10,500 houses (3,000 to 2033).


The old airfield becomes parkland reverting to community ownership and management. There will be separate open events similar to this one looking at the proposals for the airfield but if you wish to post first thoughts on the future of the airfield at this event they will be passed to the joint Neighbourhood Plan Team.



## Hurdles to jump

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The Proposed Submission Minerals Local Plan is the minerals planning document that the County Council intend to submit to the Secretary of State for consideration by an independent Planning Inspector. Subject to an Examination in Public and the Inspector's Report, the document will be adopted by the County Council and used to determine planning applications. Once adopted, the Minerals Local Plan will become part of the statutory Development Plan for Hertfordshire.

The Briggens Estate (Olives Farm) has been identified as a 'preferred area' for minerals extraction in the plan. That is, an area of known resources where 'planning permission might reasonably be anticipated'.
